Steve Scott, Sacramento District, NYI Council, pastors, youth workers, students, family & friends, this will be my eighth report as Sacramento NYI President. I continue to be humbled by the opportunity to lead such a great group of young people and leaders across this district. To the team of NYI leaders, volunteer youth leaders, youth pastors, and pastors across our district who work week after week to remind young people that there is hope in Jesus... you all are amazing! I am incredibly proud of the students who show Jesus to their peers and who live their lives in pursuit of our God.

Below are a few highlights from the year:

- NYI General Convention 2023: The 30th General Assembly brought 164 world areas together under the Indiana Convention Center. We proclaimed that Jesus is Lord together, with over 10,000 people present at the convention center and more attendees online watching. NYI celebrated 100 years of service to youth all over the 6 regions represented; Asia Pacific, Africa, Eurasia, South America, Mesoamerica, and USA/Canada. The Convention featured workshops, business meetings, kid's events, and an exhibit hall. Each day ended with the general assembly worship service where we gathered together and worshiped as one body. The General Assembly was just phenomenal on all rounds, both the NYI portion of the convention and the Assembly as a whole. Not many get to experience the global church. To have 164 world areas under one roof, I cannot explain how awesome it was to walk down the hall of the convention center and hear various languages spoken and to understand that all that were in attendance because proclaiming that Jesus is Lord above all things. Some personal highlights for me included the worship songs sung in different languages, NYI having sermons in different languages with a translator, breakout sessions about Nazarene history, and ultimately my call to ministry. I will never be able to forget the deciding moment of being all in for what God has called me to. I was hesitant to accept the call, but I knew that God was pulling me towards Him and that I should walk forward and lean into the call that He has in store for me. It is an honor to be part of the NYI voting and have a deeper understanding of the business side of the Nazarene Church. Seeing the various Nazarene based colleges and ministries that are all over the world brings life to those in attendance and encourages our brothers and sisters across the nations. Wherever you are in the world, there are those serving on behalf of God's Kingdom. God is at work no matter the world area. - NYI/NMI Youth Mission Trip 2023: In July, our district sent a team of seven adults and six teens on a work and witness trip to Mezcala, Mexico. We cleaned and prepared the Roca De Salvation church grounds for the construction of new buildings. We also hosted a Vacation Bible School, in Mezcala which averaged 65 kids per night. The children were so excited that they would travel whether rain or shine to take part in VBS. Each night we arrived, the children were already lined up filled with anticipation for the

evenings activities. Adults and Students from different churches in our district served together with members of the local and regional leadership assigned in Mexico. Through work and service, they built strong relationships with their peers and with our host team. The youth shared testimonies with their home congregations speaking of how much the trip changed them and grew their faith. This year as we travel to Costa Rica, we will have even more students and leaders from other churches participating in the mission trip. We will partner with Encuentro and work alongside teams from 17 different states. I believe it will be an experience that strengthens not only student's relationships with God, but also their relationship with their peers from other churches and states.
